- To ensure that both KS1 and KS2 pupils receive high quality sporting opportunities and development
- To ensure that clubs are available for all pupils in the school
- To ensure that talented pupils are able to engage in challenging activities in PE
- To ensure that pupils who underachieve receive additional support in PE
- To ensure that resources are of good quality and that these are enhanced across a range of sports
- To ensure that pupils and families understand the benefits of a healthy lifestyle to be able to engage and achieve in sport.
- To ensure that pupils reach the expectations for swimming by the end of KS2

Pupils will be taught to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres; They will use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]. Will perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.	Swimming lessons for half termly blocks. Pupils will have catch up blocks if they are at risk of underachieving at the end of KS2.
