Dear Parents/Carers

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE AND SCHOOL PLAN

As you are probably aware, the Government's guidance on the coronavirus has changed from the 'contain' phase to one of delaying the spread of the virus. We're getting in touch to let you know what we are doing in light of this, and what we expect from all of you, to help make sure our school community keeps safe and calm.

We would like to reassure you that at Hemyock Primary School we are taking all of the necessary steps to protect our community and are continuing to follow official guidance from the Government and local authority.

WHAT IS THE CURRENT SITUATION?

The school remains open – this is the current official guidance we have been given.

All school functions continue to run as normal including Breakfast Club.

Pupils should attend unless they feel unwell – if your child has any of the following symptoms they should remain at home for 14 days:

- A new, continuous cough and/or
- A high temperature

Pupils should also remain at home for 14 days if anyone they live with has the above symptoms.

If your child is unwell or is self-isolating, report this as you would normally by calling or emailing the school office.

A number of school trips and activities will or have been cancelled. For example, Killerton Cross-Country, Exmoor Challenge, swimming lessons, Parent Evenings, clubs after school hours and assemblies. If you are in any doubt, please do contact the school office.

We'll keep you up to date with any changes to the current situation.



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WHAT WE ARE DOING TO PROTECT AND SUPPORT PUPILS AND STAFF

- If staff/children appear to be showing symptoms, they are kept apart and sent home immediately.
- Hand washing for all children, staff and visitors on entry to/exit from the building.
- Regular supervised handwashing is in place, including before eating/after using the toilet; soap is available in all spaces.
- Children and staff are being reminded not to touch their face.
- Children and staff are reminded to cough/sneeze into tissue.
- Physical contact is being kept to a minimum, including within subjects like PE, break times and assemblies.
- Visitors to the school site have been stopped for all “non-essential” activities.
- There is a planned cleaning schedule, focusing on high touch surfaces e.g. door handles, tables.
- Children and staff are being encouraged to take very regular drinks.
- Windows are being kept open.

WHAT WE NEED YOU TO DO

If you have recently changed your contact details, please inform the school office as soon as possible via email.

Talk to your children about the coronavirus. It is a scary time and we should make sure children feel supported. BBC Newsround has regular updates for younger children and YoungMinds has practical steps older children can take to help with anxiety.

Come and collect your child straight away, if we ask you to (we’ll contact you if they become ill with either a temperature or a new, continuous cough).

Check that your child has access to the Google Classroom from home, and let us know if there are any issues (so we can make sure we are well prepared for remote learning if the school does need to close at some point). Pupils have had their log ins shared with them, they have practised using this in school and we will send out instructions for this this week.

WHAT HAPPENS IF THE SCHOOL HAS TO CLOSE?

We will only close if we are either officially advised to do so or we don’t have enough staff to run the school.



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While the school remains open, we will not routinely provide home learning. In the event that the school is closed, home learning will be available.

In either case, we will:

Alert parents to closure via an email and a post on our website. School re opening dates and time will be shared in the same way.

Work for pupils during school closure will be sent through the Google Classrooms online. This will be weekly and follow a set recommended timetable. Staff will monitor this but individual marking will not be expected. Please let us know if you do not have access to an online facility ASAP.

Please keep in mind that we are only sending out this information to help the school community prepare. There are currently no plans to close.
